V. Public Comment

Heather Morris requested for the board to terminate the principal and vice principal involved in an incident with her daughter that caused her extreme trauma. Ms. Morris also expressed concerns about the discrepancies in her daughter's discipline records.

Loreen Pryor thanked Dr. Martinez-Alire for the conversation they recently had. Ms. Pryor shared that EGUSD families continually reach out to her organization for assistance with site incidents.

Ms. Pryor also expressed concerns about a student on a 504 plan that isn't receiving services and is being bullied by a teacher.

Lisa Stanley and Esquisitive Huntly shared concerns about the lack of supports in place for black students, requested information about the services that are available and expressed concerns about the families from COHS requesting to meet with administration.

Emelina Mendoza shared her thoughts about the student masking mandate that is in place and requested that the district end the mask mandate.

Nicole Strange expressed concerns about low wages and requested a higher living wage.

Delia Baldwin shared concerns about the bullying and harassment that her 7th grade daughter has endured by a teacher on campus and that her 504 plan is not being accommodated.  Exploring Modern Issues in Text, Part II (ELD, Grades 11-12) (one-year equivalent, 10 credits) This Designated ELD course incorporates comprehensive English language support for English Learners (ELs) at the Expanding and Bridging levels. With a focus on expository text, this course offers instruction to support the acquisition of academic English and incorporates activities that focus on content, concepts, and language features within the text(s) being read and produced. Students within this course will be given opportunities to accelerate their proficiency in the areas of reading, writing, speaking, and listening.
- 28. Revisions to High School Courses Approved revisions to the following high school courses: Exploring Modern Issues in Text for ELs (Course #02714) (ELD, Grades 11-12)

 It is requested that the Course Title be changed to "Exploring Modern Issues in Text, Part I;" and that the curriculum be revised to indicate ERWC, Modules 1-5.

 Rationale: Revising this course will allow us to create a second Designated ELD Course (Part II) for students who have not yet reclassified. This course will remain open to both 11th and 12th grade students. Having two courses will provide additional opportunities for 11th and 12th grade students to receive Designated ELD and meet both federal and state requirements.

Machine Learning Honors (Course #12102) (CTE, Grade 12)

It is requested to change the co-requisite to read "Students need to have passed or be concurrently enrolled in Pre-Calculus," from the current co-requisite "Students need to have passed or be concurrently enrolled in AP Computer Science A."

<u>Rationale</u>: The content of this course requires a strong background in mathematics; knowledge in computer science is helpful but not required.
